

In 1946 at the age of 14, while a student at Chatham Collegiate Institute, Joan Clement became a member of a junior IODE chapter in Chatham, ON. As a founding member of **IODE Captain Garnet Brackin**, Joan held every position within her chapter.

Times have changed and so have fundraisers. Joan said, "there was a time when she and others went on a shoeshine fundraiser – walking down King Street and asking to shine men's shoes. That was one of our first ventures, being shoeshine girls. We went up King Street and we had a little box. Men in those days wore nice shoes." She added that chapter members would shine shoes for a donation. "We'd never do that today.

Many also participated in family or staff cookie exchanges for the holidays. It seemed at that time making five or six dozen cookies was a chore - how about more than 83 dozen!" Joan recalled when IODE members baked 1,000 cookies each as part of a holiday fundraiser!

At 89 years of age, Joan continues as an active member. In 2022, she received the Ontario Volunteer Service Award for 75 years of volunteerism.

Members have sponsored the children's grief program at Evergreen Hospice, two group homes housing 13 teenagers



supported by 360°Kids, Yellow Brick House, Basketeers, Markham Food Bank and more. The common link is always children - providing craft supplies and snacks for the grief program, school supplies for the teens in group homes, backpacks with teddy bears and items for children arriving at the shelter, gift bags filled with birthday party supplies for the food bank and the list goes on.

Linda's involvement with organizations such as *100 Women Who Care* (Markham), has created opportunities for her IODE chapter to help others. One of her fondest memories in giving through IODE was outfitting a young woman from the group home, who was starting university and preparing for independent living. Team members, using their experience with their children going off to university, filled a van with everything, from a computer and printer, to laundry supplies, bedding and food.

Linda has received recognition including the Cancer Society 20-Year Award, IODE National Life Membership, Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal (IODE), and the Markham Mayor's Seniors Hall of Fame Awards nomination. As a result of her philanthropic efforts Linda earned a *Portraits of Giving Lifetime Achievement Award*.

As a young girl, Vi Bjarnason Hilton learned some positive life lessons from her Icelandic grandmother (Amma) that she adheres to as an 87-year-old great grandmother (Langamma), always cultivate good people, read good books, listen to good music, feed your heart and soul, do good things for people so your life is wholesome.

Over the past 15 years as Services Chair for the **IODE Jon Sigurdsson**, Winnipeg, MB, this vivacious woman continues to hold these tenets. She has honed a network of friends, neighbours, and IODE members who regularly bring her clothing, furniture, blankets, socks and hygiene products that she sorts and distributes to the homeless, women's shelters,

transition housing, young mothers and youth programs.

During the pandemic, chapter members collected personal hygiene products and gently used purses for young mothers and youth; worked with the Mama Bear Clan and the Maya Person

Often when driving home from a visit with friends, Vi will stop at a Tim Horton's to pick up a tray of four doubledouble coffees and doughnuts. Then she will stop her car when she sees a street person and present them with the tray to share with friends. She encourages other IODE members to follow suit.
